The selection will be made based on relevance to the conference theme, relevance to learning centers and learning assistance, innovation, research methodology, and writing quality.

In addition, we invite you to participate according to your needs and interests in two additional new offerings: a session devoted to the discussion of the ins and outs of research and a session for those participants who have ideas about research projects they'd like to conduct—whether the project is an idea, in the midst of research and/or data collection, or nearing completion. This session will be conducted in small groups to provide feedback and support for research. In working this way, we will not only increase the body of knowledge on learning centers, we will also support practitioners in our work to develop best practices in serving students.
